A BILL

To establish the Senate NATO Observer Group, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. UNITED STATES SENATE NATO OBSERVER 4 GROUP.

5 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established within 6 the Senate a group of Senators to address and advise on 7 matters relating to the North Atlantic Treaty Organiza-8 tion, to be known as the "Senate NATO Observer Group".

9 (b) FUNCTIONS.—The Senate NATO Observer10 Group shall—

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(1) serve as a forum for addressing matters re lating to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization
 that fall within the jurisdictions of 2 or more com mittees of the Senate;

5 (2) advise the Senate on issues relating to the
6 North Atlantic Treaty Organization, including North
7 Atlantic Treaty Organization enlargement; and

8 (3) with respect to any matter involving the 9 North Atlantic Treaty Organization and the United 10 States Government, particularly during negotiations 11 on North Atlantic Treaty Organization enlargement, 12 engage in close interactions between and among the 13 executive branch, the Senate, the North Atlantic 14 Treaty Organization, any other member country of 15 the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, and any 16 country that is a candidate for membership in the 17 North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

18 (c) Appointment of Members.—

(1) 119TH CONGRESS.—During the 119th Congress, the Senate NATO Observer Group shall exist
in the manner established by the majority leader and
the minority leader of the Senate in the Congressional Record at the beginning of first session of the
119th Congress.

25 (2) SUBSEQUENT CONGRESSES.—

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1 (\mathbf{A}) APPOINTMENT.—Beginning in the 2 120th Congress, not later than 60 days after 3 the date on which of the first session of each 4 Congress convenes, the majority leader and the 5 minority leader of the Senate shall each appoint 6 to the Senate NATO Observer Group not more than 7 Senators. 7 8

8 (B) CO-CHAIRS.—Of the members ap-9 pointed under subparagraph (A), the majority 10 leader and the minority leader of the Senate 11 shall each appoint 1 co-chairperson of the Sen-12 ate NATO Observer Group.

(d) FOREIGN TRAVEL.—Each co-chair of the Senate
14 NATO Observer Group and 1 designated staff member
15 may engage in foreign travel for official purposes if such
16 travel is authorized by the other co-chair of the Senate
17 NATO Observer Group.

(e) INTERPARLIAMENTARY SERVICES.—The Office of
Interparliamentary Services of the Senate shall be designated to provide administrative support and protocol
functions to the Senate NATO Observer Group, and for
special delegations or travel authorized by the majority
leader or the minority leader of the Senate.

(f) USE OF FOREIGN CURRENCIES.—Beginning onthe date of the enactment of this Act, the co-chairs of the

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Senate NATO Observer Group are authorized to use funds
 in accordance with the provisions of law relating to foreign
 currencies, as codified in section 1754 of title 22, United
 States Code, for activities critical to carrying out the func tions of the Senate NATO Observer Group.

6 (g) REPORT.—Not less frequently than annually, the 7 Senate NATO Observer Group shall submit to the major-8 ity leader and minority leader of the Senate and the chair-9 person and ranking member of the Committee on Foreign 10 Relations of the Senate a report on the activities undertaken by the Senate NATO Observer Group during the 11 preceding fiscal year, including with respect to travel, leg-12 13 islative efforts, and public diplomacy initiatives.
